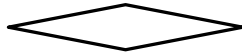

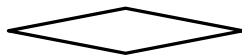

Who is being baptised at SS Stephen & Agnes Church this afternoon and his parents and godparents



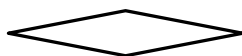
Assisting Hong Kong Migrants

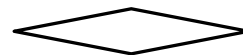
Church Opening Times

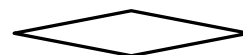


Prayer for the World

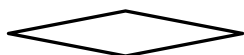
